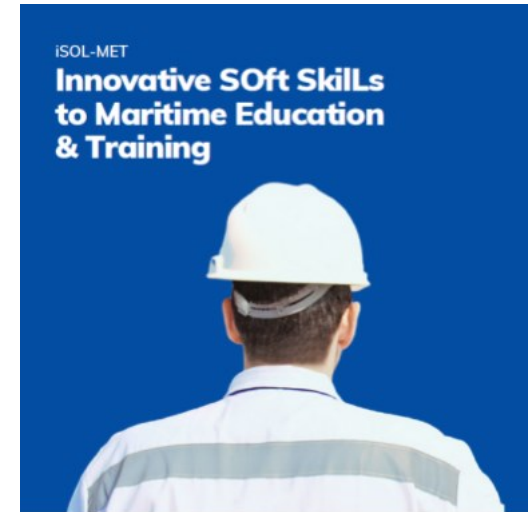

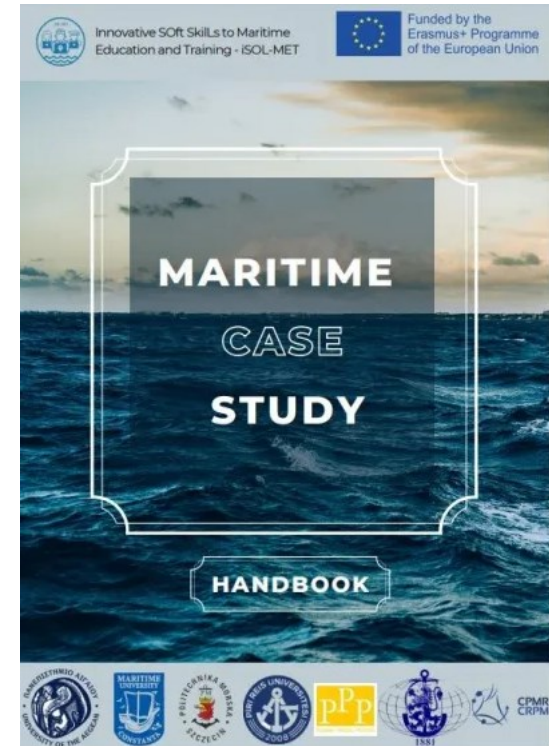

- Coordinated by the Romanian Naval Academy, [CUL-MAR-SKILLS](#) (MARitime Soft Skills for Onboard Healthy Nutrition and CULinary Arts in Seagoing Services) is an Erasmus+ project aimed at meeting the need for trained personnel to work in the galleys of all ships. The project will provide training in areas such as balanced and healthy nutrition, provisions, environmentally friendly practices in the galley and waste management. In addition, a maritime cookbook consisting of traditional maritime recipes will be created to keep the maritime cultural food heritage alive. The BBSC is mainly responsible for the dissemination of the project's deliverables.
